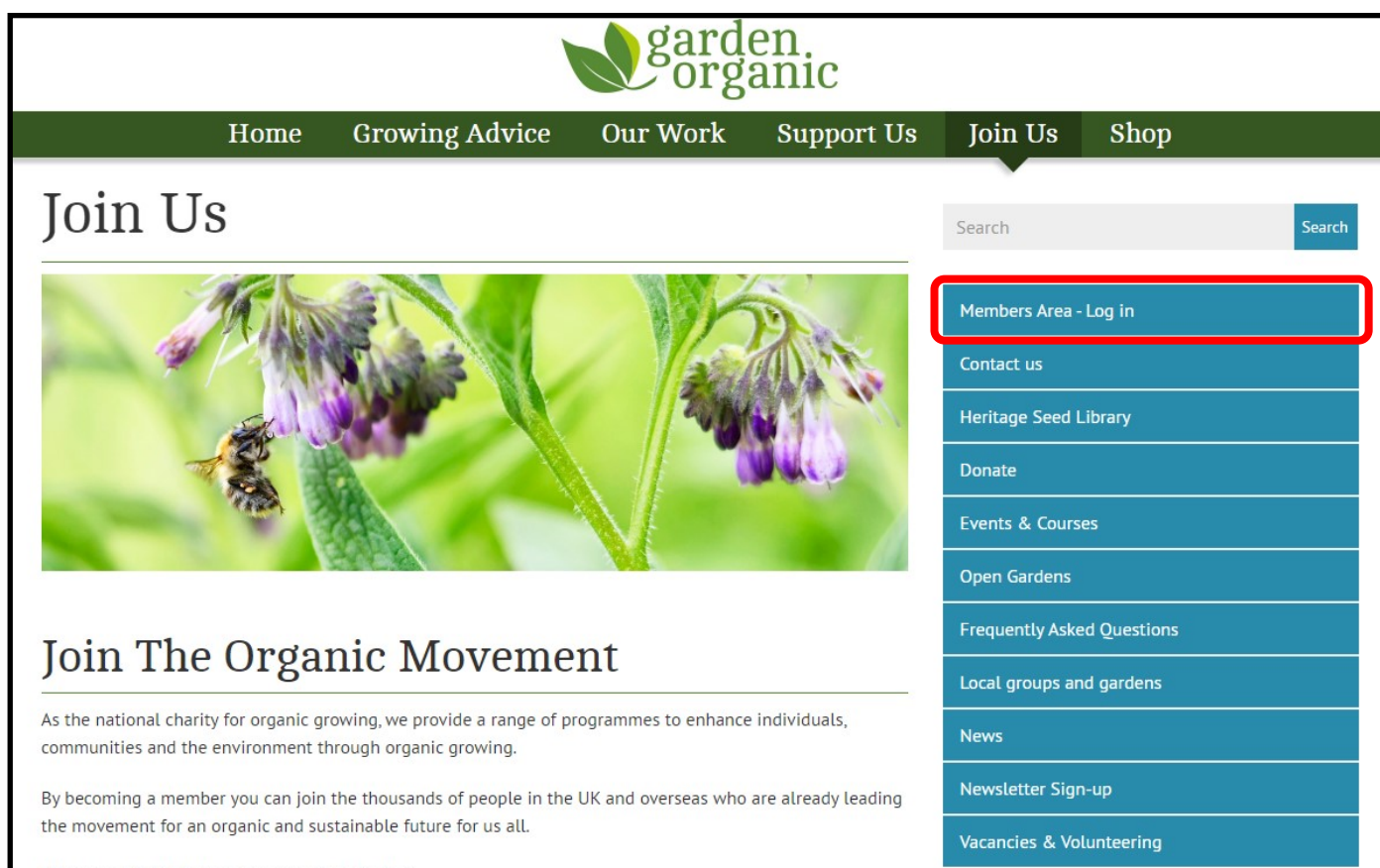


Garden Organic Members Area

From the Garden Organic website, the Members Area can always be accessed from the top of the blue menu (pictured below), regardless of which page you are on.

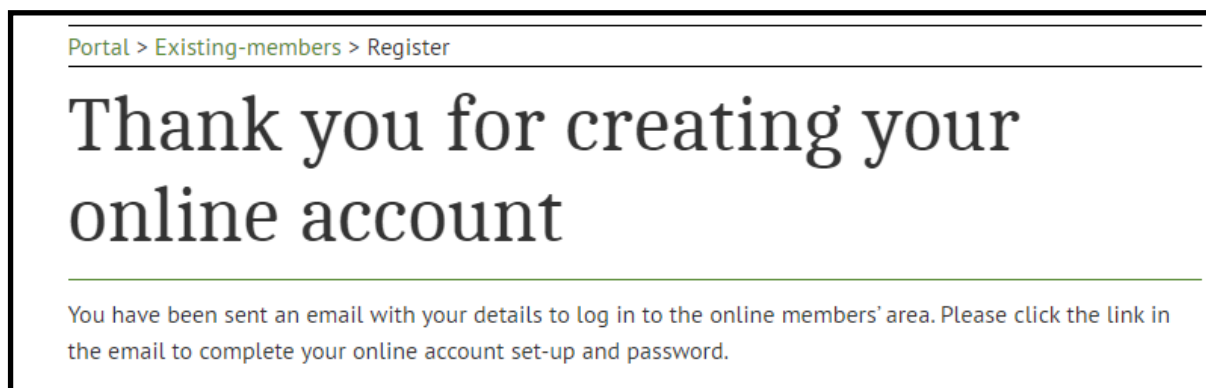

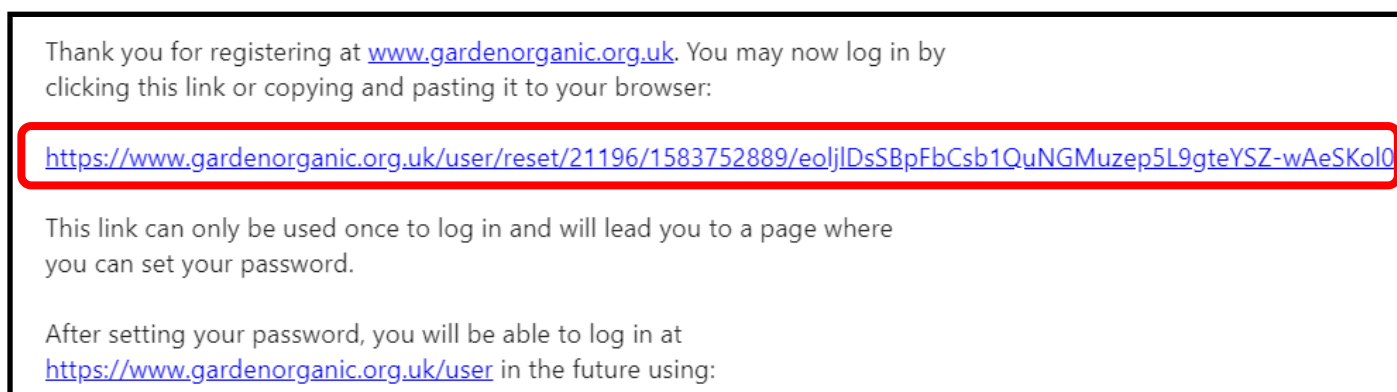

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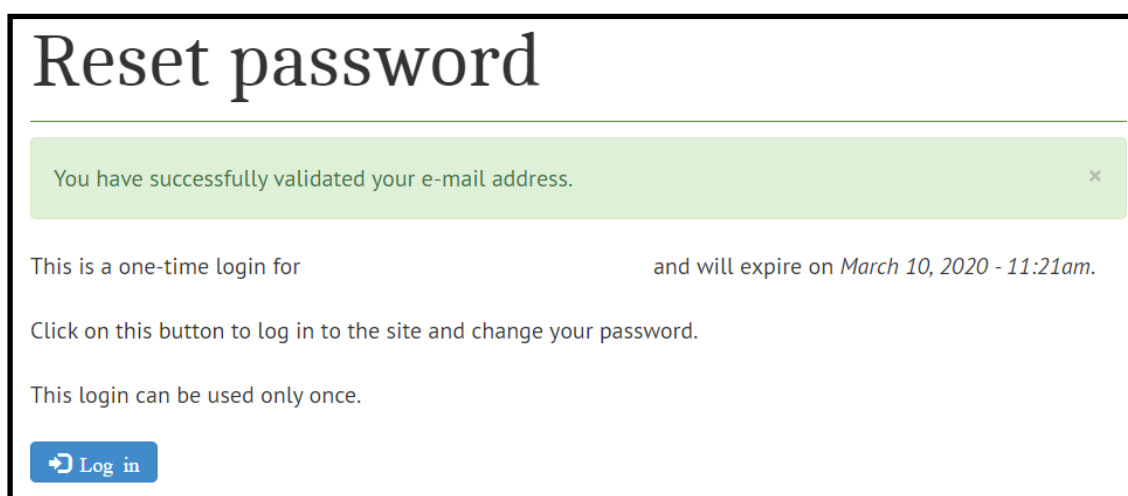
You will then see this screen, telling you that an email has been sent that you will need to go to for finishing the setup process.

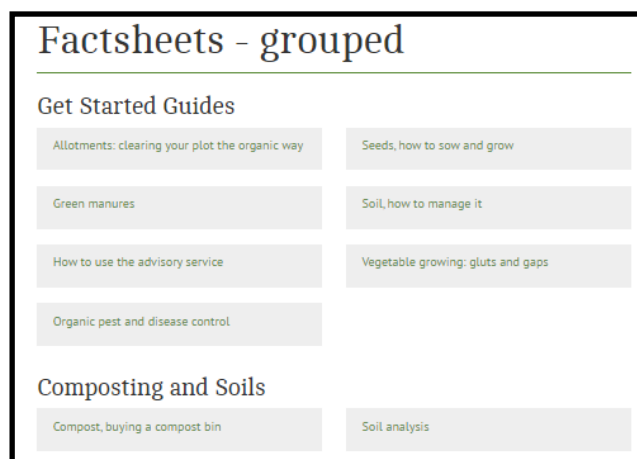
