







Although grass is great in a normal compost bin, they can make a wormery get too hot.












Citrus peel (as well as onion skins and rhubarb leaves) should not be put in a wormery as they are too acidic for the worms.






































A bit of shredded paper is great to put in your wormery (or compost bin) as it is difficult to recycle.
